

PROPOSITION 6

"The constitutional amendment providing for the creation of the State Water Implementation Fund for Texas and the State Water Implementation Revenue Fund for Texas to assist in the financing of priority projects in the state water plan to ensure the availability of adequate water resources."

Election Day is Tuesday, November 5, 2013, and the Early Voting started on Monday, October 21, 2013 and continues through Friday, November 1, 2013. There are numerous propositions included on the ballot, but there is a particular proposition that is important to water and water resources for Texas communities - **PROPOSITION 6**.

SIX Prop 6 FACTS:

- NOT supported by taxes and will NOT raise taxes
- Provide a one (1) time transfer of \$2 billion from the Texas "Rainy Day Fund" to a new fund that will be used for water infrastructure projects
- Provides loan money at favorable interest rates to political subdivisions only
- Loan money to only be used for prioritized projects that are included in the State Water Plan
- Help protect against future drought
- Provide water resources needed to serve Texas now and in the future
